YorkCounts' challenge to student writers, artists: What makes York County One Great Community?

York, January 13, 2010 – We talk a lot about “quality of life” here at YorkCounts. But we admit it’s something of an imprecise phrase. Depending on who you ask, it could mean good jobs or inexpensive homes or quality schools. Or it could mean something else completely.

For our 2010 Community Summit, YorkCounts and PeoplesBank have teamed up to offer a challenge to school students across York County: Tell us, through an essay, in a work of art or in a video your answer to this question: What makes York County One Great Community?

Any York County student is eligible to participate. Entries will be divided into three categories: elementary school (up to grade 6), middle school (grades 7 and 8) and high school (grades 9-12). Essays should be 500 words or less. Videos should be no longer than five minutes. One winner will be chosen from each category, and each winner will receive a \$250 savings bond donated by PeoplesBank. Winners will be recognized during the summit, and entries may be included in the annual report or posted on the YorkCounts Web site, www.yorkcounts.org.
