

Metro-York Project Co-Chairs

The following volunteers have agreed to champion Metro-York recommendations as task forces form and the conversation moves forward after November 15, 2007.

Carl Anderson (399-2160) is an attorney with Barley Snyder and has extensive experience in civil litigation and as counsel to small and medium sized closely held companies, many minority owned. Originally from York, after practicing for over two decades in Cleveland, Carl returned to Pennsylvania at the urging of Governor Rendell to serve as chief counsel to the Pennsylvania Department of Banking. Carl received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Central State University, his Master of Social Work degree from the University of Pittsburgh and his Juris Doctorate from Boston College Law School. He is Board President of the Community Progress Council in York and serves on the boards of York County Community Against Racism (YCCAR) and the York Little Theatre.

Dave Meckley (424-2100) founded Strategic Advantage, Inc. in 2001. Strategic Advantage is a consulting company that works with privately held firms to help owners build a senior management team and board structure. He serves on five business boards. For most of his professional career, Dave was president of Flinchbaugh Engineering, Inc. Dave has served on the boards of numerous community organizations, has been an elected official and currently serves on the boards of the York County Community Foundation (chairman), the Cultural Alliance of York County (chairman) and Better York. He's also a past chairman of YorkCounts. Dave graduated from Cornell University with a BS in Engineering. He lives in York, Pennsylvania with his wife, Betsy. Dave and Betsy have two adult children.

Fred Botterbusch (741-4900) is a member of the Dallastown Area School Board and is president-elect of the Pennsylvania School Boards Association. He is a member of the corporate board of the YMCA of York and York County and was the vice president and a founding member of Leadership York. John Krout (846-8879) retired from First Union National Bank in 2001 as a commercial lender. John's career started in the mid 1960s as the owner of the John D. Krout Insurance Agency. Krout served as a York City Councilman in the early 1970s and as Mayor of York from 1974 to 1978. Later, in the early 1990s, he served on the Board of Supervisors of Springettsbury Township. John was Chairman of the York Area Chamber of Commerce in the early 1980s and has served on a number of boards, including those of the Red Cross and York Hospital. John is a member of the York East Rotary Club and chairman of the York County Industrial Development Authority. He's a member of various Masonic organizations. Glenn Kaufman (845-4585) heads the York County Alliance for Learning and has been a Pennsylvania public schools educator for 35 years. He was the principal of Central York High School from 1993 to 2004. Glenn is an active member of the Pennsylvania Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development and the Pennsylvania Principals Association. Denny Baughman (266-6057) has been one of York County's leading education administrators. He was superintendent of Northeastern York schools from 1993 to 2007 and assistant superintendent for York City schools from 1982 to 1993. Denny is on the board of the York County Library and has served on the boards of the Rotary Club of York, the Strand-Capitol Performing Arts Center and the Community Progress Council. He was also part of the Health York County Coalition. In 2007, the York County Chamber of Commerce named Denny the county's Educator of the Year.

Sue Krebs (846-0418) is an executive with The Wolf Organization. She worked as a self-employed editor and publisher for more than 25 years. Susan's publication, The Political Collector, focused on American political campaigns and political history. Sue serves on the board of York City Dollars for Scholars. She also serves as program co-chair for the Women's Giving Circle of York. She is now active in the outreach ministry of The Episcopal Church of St. John the Baptist which includes work for Habitat for Humanity and Our Daily Bread. Sue is a graduate of York High and Connecticut College with a degree in Philosophy and is an 8th-generation York Countian. She is married to David Confer and they are the parents of two grown children.
